

#### Art 1. Definition

1.1- The Network of Accredited Clinical Skills Centres in Europe (hereafter known as NASCE) is established as a Multidisciplinary Joint Committee (MJC) of the Union Européenne des Médecins Spécialistes (UEMS) and follows UEMS statutes, rules and directives.



# **Changes** since NASCE Accreditation

#### Networking!!!

- Intense collaboration within and outside center e.g. nursing school
- Nationally and Internationally

  - Trainees need *protected* time
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  - Don't forget to *train the trainers*!
  - **Soft skills** do matter!
- Independent Quality Control organism
- Financial rewards
- Research & Development stimulated
  - New teaching modalities
  - Tailor-made seminars

## New or improved training courses

- Training courses for *medical devices* (Finland)
  - E-learning simulation training & assessment
    - SBE in situ
- Bootcamp for first year surgeons in training (surgery, gynecology, orthopedics, urology) – based on experiences in RCSI, CAMES (ITCIT)
- Increased number of courses including more advanced laparoscopy courses and new training modules (NSALK)
- Survey about integration PROSPECT in daily practice in CAMES, ITCIT – accepted in EJVES
